## **Feature**

## **AVLS (Automatic Volume Limiter System)**

The AVLS selector allows you to limit the maximum volume of your WALKMAN personal stereo without degrading its sound quality.

- When the AVLS selector is set to either position 1 or 2, (around 95 dl dB respectively) the volume will be kept at a moderate level without degradation of the sound quality, even if you attempt to turn the volur up higher.
- When the AVLS selector is turned off, you will be able to enjoy the ful volume capability of your WALKMAN personal stereo.





## **Precautions**

#### Notes on batteries

- . Insert the batteries with correct polarity.
- When the unit is not to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid the damage caused by battery leakage and corrosion.
- When the batteries become weak, the BATT indicator will glow faintly and playback sound will be distorted or unstable. In this case, replace both batteries with new ones.

Concerning the battery life, see "Specifications".

#### Handling your WALKMAN

- Do not drop nor give a shock to the unit. Doing so may cause malfunction of the unit.
- Do not leave the unit in a location near heat sources or in a place subject to direct sunlight or sand, excessive dust, moisture, rain, mechanical shock, or in a car with its windows closed.
- If the unit has not been used for a long time, set it in the playback mode and warm it up for a few minutes before inserting a cassette.
- Before opening or closing the cassette compartment lid, be sure to wipe off water, dust or sand on the exterior of the unit.
- Since water in the headphones jack may cause rust, cover it with the attached rubber cap when the headphones are not in use.
- If the unit or the headphones are immersed in salt water, be sure to wash them in still fresh water. Never wash them under running water, and never use soap or detergent.
- The supplied headphones are not meant to be immersed in water or come in continuous contact with water. If they are accidentally dropped into water or get wet, dry them with a soft cloth. Never use an electric hair dryer.
- The use of cassettes longer than 90 minutes is not recommended except for a long continuous playback.

#### Notes on Headphones

#### Road safety

Do not use headphones while driving, cycling, or operating any motorized vehicle. It may create a traffic hazard and is illegal in many areas. It can also be potentially dangerous to play your headsets at high volume while walking, especially at pedestrian crossings. You should exercise extreme caution or discontinue use in potentially hazardous situations.

## · Preventing hearing damage

Avoid using headphones at high volume. Hearing experts advise against continuous, loud and extended play. If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume of discontinue use.


Keep the volume at a moderate level. This will allow you to hear outside sounds and to be considerate to the people around you.


#### About the rubber packing

- Any sand or dust on the rubber packing will prevent the cassette compartment lid from closing tightly, and water may leak in. Brush off the dust once in a while.
- We recommend the packing to be changed every year. Replacement packing is available at an authorized Sony Service Facility.

# **Opening and Closing the Cassette Compartment Lid**






If the cassette compartment lid cannot be opened\*

When the cassette compartment lid opens, remember to close the rubber cap. (The unit is not water-resistant with the lid open.)

\* Since the unit is airtight, you may not be able to open the lid because of a sudden change in air pressure inside the unit which happens after being transported on a plane or moving from a warm place to a cold place.





